
Public engagement opportunity #1 summary

January 2022

Early public input was gathered in the fall of 2021 on existing transportation conditions along Highway 61 through Two Harbors. Over 400 individuals responded to our online survey and submitted feedback through our interactive mapping tool.




Recreational/entertainment and shopping trip types were the most commonly reported used of Highway 61.


Survey respondents were from across the state


Roughly 40% of stakeholders reported living within the City of Two Harbors, with an equal portion living outside the city but within Lake or Cook counties and 22% live outside these areas.

Online interactive mapping tool


A total of 65 stakeholders submitted unique comments
