





Why an equitable Development Principles and Scorecard?

The competing interests of development **Profit > Livability > Lives**

Traditional Process



- Municipality Comprehensive Planning & Zoning
- Developer submits project that meets comp plan & zoning
- Neighborhoods asked to approve
- Municipality approves with or without asking project to address neighborhood concerns




Equitable Process



- Community engagement to develop **community vision** for neighborhood which is included with Comprehensive plans, thus **supported by municipality**
- Developer engages community to create project that **supports community vision**
- Developer submits project that has **full community support** to municipality
- Municipality only approves projects that fully engaged community and **provides benefits** for those most vulnerable to change



The Equitable Development Principles & Scorecard



- Developed by **community** over several years
- Creates shared definitions, **framework**, and vision
- Tool for **conversations** that puts community at center – NOT to be just used “off the shelf”
- It’s **only as good as its users**. The Scorecard is reliant on community engagement and strong equity lens



- City of Minneapolis and Minneapolis Park & Rec Board – Upper Harbor Terminal
- West Side Community Organization
- Blue Line Coalition
- Harrison Neighborhood (in progress)
- Metro Bloom
- Several other Scorecard uses are being thought through

ADAPTABILITY

VERSIONS

1. Metro Bloom - inspired by Scorecard & adapted parts of Scorecard for their RFPs recognizing their investments in watershed management provide community benefits that must take into account equity issues
2. Cycles for Change - led by queer, trans and femme cyclists who's voices have lacked in transit planning discussions, developed a supplemental Scorecard focused on Transportation: <https://cyclesforchange.org/wp-content/uploads/2018/08/Copy-of-Equitable-development-scorecard-final-July-2018.pdf>
3. City of Minneapolis and Minneapolis Park & Rec Board - engaged communities in the Upper Harbor Terminal development, and together adapted the Scorecard to create criteria for the Upper Harbor Terminal
4. West Side Community Organization - shaping their organizing and organization around the Scorecard, engaging community members, institutions and businesses in the 5 principles of the Scorecard to create their own West Side Scorecard which lets developers know what communities expect from any investments in their

community

5. Blue Line Coalition - developed a Scorecard for the whole blue line extension for consistency across the five municipalities it goes through per the expected equitable outcomes from Blue Line LRT investment and the investments it spurs

IN THE MAKING

1. Harrison Neighborhood is using the Scorecard to shape conversations with a local developer who wants to ensure his project benefits the local neighborhood.
2. City of St Paul passed an ordinance directing PED to develop and employ an equitable development scorecard
3. Towerside Innovation District is committed to looking at how the Scorecard can be used to support its equity goals in conjunction with ECODISTRICTS
4. Reconnect Rondo is interested in using the Scorecard as an engagement tool to develop a shared community vision for a potential land bridge
5. Cycles for Change has another vision working on
6. Another organization is looking at the Scorecard as a means to be intentional in mitigating gentrification by new or revitalized green spaces


