Presentation overview

A new Minnesota law empowers work zone flaggers to report drivers that violate the stop sign used by flaggers to control traffic in work zones. Similar to the bus stop arm violation law, enforcement may issue a citation within 4 hours of the incident. The fine for this citation is \$300. The law also requires specific training for flaggers in order for them to be able to report violations. This session will go over:

- A summary of the law
- Requirements, including training
- MnDOT's Flagger training program
- How to identify vehicles and drivers

Local agencies are especially encouraged to view due to the training requirements.
