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Additional requirements

- Route Survey MUST BE LEGIBLE
- The physical (driven) route survey must match the exact route on the permit application
- Survey's must be completed no more than 14 days prior to permit issuance.
- The survey vehicle must use a nonconductive, nondestructive, flexible, and readily breakable height pole set to a minimum of 6 inches higher than the highest part of the load.
- You must have a minimum 1 foot on each side of vehicle/load, and a minimum of 6 inches clearance under trailer/semi-trailer.
- The survey must include low bridges, narrow roadways, railroad crossings, overhead obstructions or anything interfering with the load's turning radius such as but not limited to:
 - Traffic signals
 - Public utilities
 - Anything that may result in the need for alternative routing and/or additional assistance from a third-party such as a bucket truck or traffic control company to remove/replace obstructions or close roads prior to movement.
- The survey must identify which traffic lane is to be used to maneuver under a low clearance. Maneuvers, such as backing up or using opposing traffic lanes, must be identified on the state road route and details section.

Acknowledgement

The Minnesota Department of Transportation may revoke existing applications and refuse to issue future specialized hauling permits when:

- Information or details in the survey are not valid.
- A physical route survey performed on a date other than shown below.
- A physical route survey done using lesser minimums than noted above.

By submitting this form, both the motor carrier and representative surveying the route acknowledge all requirements were met during the physical route survey.
